Wilma's story begins at the time of her birth, December 7, 1983. She was born with a condition called hypopituitarism. This causes her to have seizures due to low blood sugar, not to be able to grow on her own, and to have thyroid problems. The day she was discharged from the NICU the Dr. told us that Wilma was going to be a very special child and that since she was having seizures for 72 hours she was most likely to be mentally retarded. My husband and I, even though we did not know God and His mercy, believed and trusted that she was going to be well. The years went by, and although there were no signs of mental retardation, Wilma's seizures were often and other health problems were diagnosed. We went through a lot with her not knowing the plans God had with the family. We came to Texas in 1998. Wilma was 15 years old, the medical treatments continued and she was looking awesome. One day she got up in the morning to go to school and told me that an angel was in her room watching her. I didn't think much about it and said, "That's your guardian angel looking after you and taking care of you." In 2005 my family was introduced to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. That November was the beginning of our walk in faith and we understood that God has a purpose with each one of us. Wilma was in college and attending every prayer service on Tuesdays and our Praise and Worship service Sundays at our church. She graduated 2 years ago as an RN and is currently working in the NICU helping and loving her babies. On several occasions parents, grandparents and even our pastor have told her that she has an Angel over her shoulder. I believe that God has a very special angel watching over Wilma. She is an Angel herself; she is a sweet, loving and caring young woman. She loves the Lord with all her heart. She is the most precious gift that the Lord put in our hands to care for, to love and to cherish.
